

The camp - a place north of London, ON where God's creation comes together with respect for each other and the environment - received a grant from the Wesley C Smith Fund for their new virtual camp outreach program, Bimini Connects.

While the COVID-19 pandemic prevented on-site camping, Camp Bimini leaders knew that they could still provide a summer camp program to their campers and families. Seventeen counsellors,

twenty adults, and twenty more youth song leaders volunteered to adapt Camp Bimini's regular camp programs to an online platform.

The results were inspiring. "I cannot say thank you enough to Camp Bimini for adapting to bring camp to our home during these difficult times!" says Kathy, a parent of two sons who participated in the program. "Bimini Connects is a program that was invaluable in filling the void that was created when overnight camp and sports were all cancelled in 2020."



The 8-week online camp resulted in over 330 hours of watch time, including a family in Saskatchewan, whose mother had attended Camp Bimini as a child and was excited to share "her camp" with her children. What an incredible success!"
