Blessings to you All.

On Tuesday I had the privilege of attending the virtual tour of the Woodland Cultural Centre in Brantford Ontario. It was once the Mohawk Institute Residential School; it closed in 1970 and has since been restored as a 'museum of conscience.'

To be honest, I didn't how I would feel taking this tour. A few years ago, at Atlantic School of Theology, I studied the Truth And Reconciliation; the course was taught by an Indigenous elder and it included many debates, stories of genocide, and participation in rituals. I thought I had a good understanding of the issues. And yet, on Tuesday evening I found myself numb from the experience of touring the Mohawk Institute. The only thing I can liken it to was when I toured Dachau Concentration camp near Munich.

I won't describe all the graphic details of the conditions that included malnutrition, severe punishments, slave labour, and sexual abuse. They were too graphic and too many to mention. But I will share one of the things that really struck home to me – each child was just a number!

When the children arrived, they were stripped of their clothes, any possessions from home were taken away, they had their head shaved, and from that time on they were given a number. They no longer had a name – just a number. Their numbers apparently separated them from other members of their family, for example if three sisters arrived together, they were given sperate numbers e.g. 10, 18, 29, to keep them apart. Everything the children did was according to their number – they would line up in number, had beds assigned by number, sat in class according to number, bathed and ate according to number, and were only ever addressed by their number. As I took in this information, I felt that all humanity was stripped from these children, as they were stripped of their name and identity.

The gospels report that Jesus describes how God loves us so much, that every hair on our head is counted (Luke 12:7, Matthew 10:30). If we are this important to God, how is it that we can treat others with such indignation and indifference? And this is not just the story of a few children - there were 150,000 children in the residential schools.

I share this information with you to encourage you to reflect. We are all called to live in respect and peace with each other – not just because of the Truth and Reconciliation, but because we are people of faith. We are 'commanded' to love each other. The survivors of the residential schools just want to be heard. Let us take time to allow them to tell their truths. We can not ignore and bury this painful part of our history if healing is to occur.




