June is Gay Pride Month. The United Church of Canada joins the country in celebrating lesbian, gay, bisexual, trans, and 2-Spirit (LGBTQ2) people. It has been 33 years since the United Church's 1998 decision to declare that all people, regardless of sexual orientation, are welcome as full members in the church. And that all members—including those who identify as LGBTQ2—are eligible to be ordained ministers. But let's face it—not all communities of faith are living out that welcome. There are 99 communities of faith in the WOW region (of which Grace is a member), but only 9 affirming communities of faith in the region! We talk about accepting diversity, and being radically welcoming, but do we walk the talk?

On June 12, 2018, Historica Canada released the first "Heritage Minute" focusing on the LGBTQ2 community's fight against discrimination—a continued struggle for many, many non-straight people across this country. Thousands of people shared the video on social media, beaming with Canadian pride. (Click on this link to view <u>Historica Moment</u>). Given that Heritage Minutes were launched in 1991, perhaps the more appropriate public response should have been, "what took so long?" as opposed to a collective pat-on-the-back.

It is also easy to question why the church's full embrace of LGTBQ2 people happened in the late 80s, but it took three, full decades longer for UC to launch the Iridesce Living Apology project -a project that reflects and talks about people's LGBTQ2 experiences leading up to, and proceeding, the church's 1988 decision. We have come a long way; we do understand more the importance of listening. But, we still have a long way to go! I am certain that Jesus, one of the world's greatest social agitators, would have joyfully donned rainbow-coloured robes, and raucously marched in as many Pride parades as possible. We must never stop shouting our openness from the rooftops. We must never stop drawing the circle wider, acting on that divine nudge to find the next barrier to compassionately break down. We must all play a role in ensuring that anyone who walks up the steps of any United Church is always radically welcomed.

Cook's Corner: What to do with Rhubarb!

At the virtual coffee hour after church last Sunday, there was much talk about what do with the abundance of rhubarb right now. Tricia Wettlaufer kindly shared her suggestions of Rhubarb Cake, and Rhubarb pie, and we thought it would be fun to share the recipe with everyone. I invite others to share any special seasonal recipe for Cook's Corner.

Thanks Tricia – now the only question is when we can taste them in a live coffee hour!

Rhubarb Cake

Batter:

½ cup butter 1½ cups white sugar

1 egg 1 tsp. vanilla 2 cups sifted all purpose flour 1 tsp. soda

1½ tsp. salt

1 cup buttermilk (or use 1 cup milk with 1 tbsp. lemon juice, let sit for 5 minutes)

2 cups chopped rhubarb in ½ inch pieces

1 tbsp. flour

Topping:

1/4 cup butter

2 tsp. cinnamon

1 cup firmly packed brown sugar

Batter: Cream butter and sugar until smooth and creamy; beat in egg and vanilla.

Sift together 2 cups flour, soda and salt. Add to the creamed mixture alternately with the buttermilk, making 3 dry and 2 liquid additions. Toss the rhubarb with 1 tbsp. flour and mix it gently into the batter. Spoon into buttered 13 x 9 inch cake pan and smooth the surface.

Topping: Blend together all the ingredients and sprinkle evenly over the batter.

Bake at 350F for 45 minutes or until the cake has risen and browned and a toothpick inserted in centre comes out clean.

Rhubarb Pie


2 eggs, beaten

1 c. white sugar

1/4 tsp. salt

2 tbsp. flour

1 tablespoon Tapioca (if you do not have any Tapioca, use 3 to 4 tbsp. flour instead of just the 2 tbsp.) Mix all together then add 4 cups chopped rhubarb. Bake a pie crust, empty, for 10 minutes at 450F. Add pie filling and dot with butter. Bake at 400F for 10 minutes then at 350F for about 45 minutes or until set. If you want to make a custard, mix together 2 eggs well beaten, 1 cup sugar and 1 cup milk. Then add your rhubarb and cook.
