Message from Chairperson Anne Gregory

Summer 2021

I imagine that most of you, like me, are enjoying special time with grandchildren, great grandchildren, children, other family members and friends this summer now that we are able to safely be out and about. It certainly feels wonderful to socialize with them and make special memories. Don and I have been able to welcome both younger grandchildren to our apartment already and they are becoming comfortable in the new space. I also was able to enjoy a few days away with a friend and experience a new area with her. She has recently moved to Georgetown and lives in the area that was formerly The Dominion Seed House property, which I'm sure is a familiar name to most of you. There are signs provided which give the information of the area and it is quite interesting.

William and Alexandrina (Harding) Bradley purchased 80 hectares of land on the southwest limits of the village of Georgetown which they named Cedar Vale Farm. Their son Bradley started several companies and his electric small appliance business sold only by mail order. In order to keep his staff busy all year, he added a mail order seed business. Dominion Seed House was established in 1928 on Guelph St which was part of the farm. The work force was about 20 full time, but during the busy season he employed upwards of 120 people. It became the largest mail order supplier of seeds and plants in Canada for both commercial and home gardeners. Bradley introduced Canandians to a vast and reliable variety of quality seeds, bulbs and plants from around the world which he searched out personally. An average of 3000 orders arrived each day during busy season and all were filled manually. The business was large enough to have its own postal station and had customers in every province in Canada. It had a good relationship with CNR and regularly a railroad car was left on the siding beside Burn's Transport (now Olon Industries) on Friday waiting for the DSH order to be shipped.

In 1993 Marg Harding sold DSH to Perron in Quebec and then in 1995 the Canadian Federation of University Women were allowed to rescue acres of peonies, iris and dayliles which they sold. The property was sold in 1997 and a public process began to create a master plan for 54 acres which resulted in The CFUW being successful in getting 8 acres for public use. In 1999 the building was removed and townhouses were being constructed by 2001, some of which back on parkland, including the one my friend lives in. A portion of the foundation was repaired, which is believed to be the original barn and a beautiful garden established around and inside it. One corner features a pond with goldfish living and hiding among the water plants. The whole area is very colourful right now with daylilies, Rose of Sharon and coneflowers blooming and beside the meandering walking path in the greater park area the trees have plaques in front of them which name each tree. We noticed that there are no hostas anywhere in the area and decided that they must be a new addition to our gardens. It would be worth a daytrip to the area for a visit, especially if you remember the name or made purchases from DSH. It is just off highway 7 and easy to find.

Another park area that we walked is around the building and property that housed the Georgetown Boys. The historic plaque there tells a story that celebrates the generosity and humanitarian nature of Canadians. The Armenian

Genocide (1915-1923) left an overwhelming number of Armenians is dire conditions and relief efforts emerged around the world to provide aid to the refugees. In 1916 the Armenian Relief Association of Canada was begun and it, as well as later the United Church of Canada petitioned the government of Canada to allow orphaned Armenian children to enter Canada. Between 1923 and 1930, 110 boys came to live in Georgetown at what was called Cedar Vale Farm or the Armenian Boys' Farm. The boys faced cultural shock but were encouraged and through work and education became members of society here in Canada.

I have been doing some reading this summer too and am enjoying the most recent edition of Broadview, which like Paul Bartlett, I really enjoy. Each issue covers a wide range of topics and I find it interesting reading the letters to the editor to see the reaction to previous articles. If you don't already receive it, think seriously about getting a subscription this fall when the time comes to renew again or borrow a copy from someone after they are finished reading theirs. Unfortunately you can't have mine as I already pass it on to someone who also enjoys reading it. May you enjoy the rest of the summer until we are able to meet again in person at Grace United. Anne


