

#### Epiphany Cake by Claudette Derdaele

Epiphany is celebrated on January 6th this year. Whenever you mark it, why not make an Epiphany cake in honour of this week's Feast Day? The tradition places a little toy baby Jesus inside the cake and whoever gets that piece is 'king' for the day. Have a paper crown for that person to wear for the day. Have fun with it.

#### Ingredients

Cake: 3/4 c butter softened 1 3/4 c sugar 3 whole eggs 2 1/2 c cake flour 2 1/2 tsp baking powder 1/2 tsp salt 1 tsp vanilla 1 1/4 c whole milk Trinkets or charms: baby, crown, jewel, button, heart, dime, etc.

Icing: 2 sticks of butter softened 4 c powdered sugar 3/4 c cocoa powder 1/4 tsp salt 1/3 c heavy cream

#### Directions

Cake: Preheat oven to 375 F. Grease 9 x 13 baking pan. In a mixer with a whisk attachment, beat butter till soft and fluffy. Add sugar in batches. Mix until combined and fluffy, about 2 min. Add eggs one at a time, beating for 20 seconds after each addition. Add vanilla.

In a separate bowl, stir together flour, baking powder and salt. Alternate adding the flour mixture with the miker on medium-low until all the ingredients are combined.

Remove from mixer and incorporate trinkets. Pour into 9 x 13 pan and bake for 22-25 minutes until toothpick comes out clean. Allow to cool before icing.

Icing: In a mixer fitted the paddle, whip the butter till soft and smooth. Stir together the powdered sugar, cocoa and salt. Add gradually to the mixer. Drizzle in cream and whip on high until smooth. Ice the cooled cake.
