I am sure, like me, you are deeply saddened by the new restrictions for Ontario that came out this week. This is not where we had hoped to be starting a new year. But, nonetheless, this is where we are!

I know that many of you have probably heard mixed messages and a variety of numbers, some of which are very alarming. Two pieces of information that really hit home to me are:

- 1. At a recent visit to Stratford General Hospital I witnessed firsthand how some patients are in beds in the corridors of the Emergency Dept for up to 3 days, simply because there are no beds left and this is just the beginning of January! The rising number of cases are very real, and it places an extreme stress on our healthcare system and medical staff.
- 2. By the end of January you will probably personally know someone who has had Covid perhaps you already do. When we have that kind of close connection, we realize that we are not invincible we truly are in this together. So, what can we do? Here are some suggestions:
- For your personal safety, please get vaccinated if you aren't already or get the booster as soon as possible. It isn't too late.
- Please reach out if you know someone who needs help booking a shot, or a ride to a vaccination clinic. Or call Rev. Gail for help if you personally need help. (519 703 1954)
- If you know someone who is in isolation due to the virus, please reach out and ask them if they need anything offer to pick up groceries for them; send them a short text each day to let them know that you are thinking of them.
- Being shut in, with or without the virus is taking its toll on all of us, so take time this week to call at least 3 people, especially those that live alone. Reach out in love to see how they are doing!
- Always wear a good mask in all indoor settings and try cutting back on in-person events. Use Zoom or the telephone to connect (I know, I know!). We had a lovely chat on zoom with 11 ladies at Sit N Knit, Stay N Crochet this week.
- Understand that many people are sick, which means that services will be slow; some businesses will have limited hours or be closed, and customer service employees will be stressed. Be gentle with others.; expect nothing to be "normal." Say "please" and "thank you" more often. Tip generously. Be quick with a kind word.
- If you like to bake make a plate of cookies for our medical staff in grateful appreciation for all they do. Rev. Gail will take them into SGH for you.
- As children are back to online school, offer to help any parents with young children. Perhaps take them out for a walk to give parents a break.
- And, PRAY, PRAY, PRAY!

We are in this together, vaccinated or not, so let's support and care for each other in love.



In late February we are hoping to have an online auction that highlights






Who is Jesus to you?

2021 in Reflection

- Courageous conversations: We have heard conversations around racial justice, equity, spiritual growth, climate crisis, and the future happening across the country, as we listen and discern together in new ways.
- **Being community in new ways:** We have seen that even though community gathering might look different during these times, they're still very, very possible. We have seen new communities of faith sprout that have no intention of being face-to-face. We have seen that being in deep, supportive relationship can happen in new ways.
- **Getting outside the building:** From outdoor living rooms to community gardens, to Wild Church, to walking church, we have seen that the church is not a building and that the church is its people.
- Finding a new way: Many community ministries have found a way forward, from creating new revenue streams to developing new partnerships, to starting new experiments. In many cases, these experiments have enabled community ministries across the country to connect with even more people than before the pandemic and have resulted in new offerings that will help them remain resilient in the years ahead.

Becoming a partner of choice: New and unexpected partners have continued to lean in this year. Communities of faith have formed new relationships with organizations that have common goals or had new conversations with existing partners that have deepened their reciprocity and mutuality or found that non-church funders are seeing the tremendous value and importance of communities of faith in their neighbourhoods. We have seen communities of faith receive Federal and provincial grants from Canada SummerJobs, NewHorizons and MyMainstreet grants.
