So, it is Olympic season, and one thing that I love to watch is figure skating.

But, this year, as I watch our Canadian pairs figure skater, **Vanessa James**, I can't help wondering about the lack of diversity. While we often see a high representation of BIPOC community (Black, Indigenous, People of Colour) on the running track, have you ever



stopped to question why we do not see many on the ice rink? In fact, there have only been three black skaters at this competition level: **Elladj Baldé** and Vanessa James (from Canada) and **Maé-Bérénice Méité** (from France).

Now, while this might not be of concern for you – what about if you were a BIPOC child that had a dream of being a figure skater? Where are your role models? Vanessa James, a native of Scarborough Ontario, says, ""It means a lot to me to be that representation for young girls and boys. If this is the first time they're watching figure skating, it would be a shame for them to look at the sport and say, 'There's nobody who looks like me."

James actively became involved in Figure Skating Diversity and Inclusion Alliance (fsdia.org) – an organization founded by Elladj Baldé (who moved to Quebec at 2 years old.) The program is aimed to promote greater diversity to the sport. James says: "The whole goal is to motivate kids of color to want to skate, know that they're capable and also provide the resources. We're also trying to promote change so that skating can retain these skaters."

James began the Big Skater/Little Skater program, where the goal is that for every pair of skates that a big skater gets for the season, a brand donates a pair of skates to a BIPOC skater who is part of our Big Skater/Little Skater program. James says: "Along with a pair of skates, they wil also get a mentor. Maé, myself and [FSDIA founder] Elladj Baldé are the first three mentors and we have three skaters that we will be mentoring and motivating. Giving them some technical help. It's a connection so they can realize that they count, and we're here to encourage them to be their best."

Let us all celebrate diversity as we remember that Black Lives Matter.

## RECIPES FROM PAST YOUTH ACTIVITIES

### Cinnamon Hearts

2 Tbsp (30 mL) granulated sugar

 $1\frac{1}{2}$  tsp (7 mL) ground cinnamon

1-11 oz (311g) tube of plain bread stick dough

Place the oven rack in the centre position. Turn the oven to 350F (175C). Grease baking sheet with cooking spray. Set aside. Put sugar and cinnamon into a bowl. Stir.

Unroll dough. Sprinkle dough with sugar mixture. Separate dough into 8 strips along perforations. Roll and twist strips into 14 inches (35 cm) long. Form strips into a heart. Pinch dough at top and bottom points of the heart.

Place hearts on a baking sheet. Bake for 18 to 20 minutes until golden. Put the baking sheet on a wire rack. Turn the oven off. Let cool for 5 minutes. Makes 8 hearts.

## **CROCHET SQUARE PROJECT**

What is it?: The Tavistock Agricultural Society is promoting a community project to encourage artistic flair, crafting talent, and involvement in supporting the Fair event for 2022! If you can crochet, we ask that you crochet a 12-inch square and submit it to be assembled, with other squares, to make an afghan(s) that will be sold as a fundraiser. This is not a competition, and no prizes will be awarded.

**Eligibility:** All area residents, young and old, are eligible to enter. You may enter as many squares as you like.

#### Criteria for Entries:

- 1. All entries must be clean and smoke/perfume free.
- 2. The yarn used must be acrylic, worsted weight and any colour of your choice.
- 3. The square should be blocked and measure 12-inches square when completed.
- 4. Entries must be primarily crocheted, but other fiber, needle and crafting arts may be incorporated in your design. The overall impression must be crochet.

- 1. Print your name, address and phone number on a piece of paper or card and attach this to your crocheted square.
