Let us find out what's our grateful moment and say how we are grateful today. May our Thanksgiving continue long after the last morsel of turkey is gone. May thankfulness and praise become a natural overflow of our grateful heart.

This season of Thanksgiving, and you're more than likely already thinking

about others. Maybe for some that means lending a helping hand, or for others who are difficult from suffering, especially from hunger, it could mean sharing your grateful heart. Whatever the case, we are blessed by Jesus Christ, our Savior.

Who was Jesus referring to when he advised his followers to pray: "Give us this day our daily bread?" Who is the "us"?

"When we say the prayer, we often think 'us' refers to ourselves; after all, we are the ones praying. 

The barns were full of healthy stock Farrowing, feeding each day by the clock A second job, to make ends meet Supporting a family, a daily feat


Where well the energy come today Enough rain and sun each day we pray Price and weather we have no control All the worry and stress are taking its toll
