


A History of Grace United Church, Tavistock

- 1840: Preachers on horseback from the German Evangelical Association in Waterloo County reach the Tavistock area. A church is established near Tavistock at Balaclava (the Ratz Church). Members of this congregation later establish congregations in East Zorra, Lingelbach, Sebringville, South Easthope, and Tavistock.
- 1848: Henry Eckstein builds a hotel at the five corners.
- 1857: The coming of the railroad brings industry and a rise in the population.
- 1860: The Presbyterians erect a log structure on lot 30, 10th line of East Zorra for a place to worship. In 1874 they move to a different location on the 10th line. This church is called Burns Church. The congregation becomes part of a two-point charge with Brooksdale until 1920 when Burns and Knox Presbyterian Church in Tavistock form a charge.
- 1862: The Methodist minister Rev. Elsworth holds camp meetings on a hill north of the Trout Creek in Harmony. In 1864 a small frame church is built on Lot 1, Concession 7 of Downie Township on land donated by a Mr. Dunsmore.




The red brick church in Harmony is built in 1874.

1865: A "class" of thirty members of Evangelicals meets in Tavistock. William Morlock is the class leader. The first trustees are elected in 1869. In 1870, the first church building, a frame structure, is erected. The Stratford Weekly Beacon reports, "The new and handsome church recently erected in this village by the Wesley Evangelical Denomination was opened on Sunday last." (On the current site of Grace United Church.)




- 1865: A wonderful revival is held near Lingelbach by the "German Methodists" (Evangelicals). As a result, two classes are formed, one in North Easthope and one in South Easthope.
- 1874: The South Easthope church (Evangelical) is built (replaces the Ratz Church). The Church is first known as Salem Methodist Church (later EUB). South Easthope and Tavistock form the Tavistock Mission in 1870. In 1909, SEH is taken from Tavistock and added to Lingelbach to form a circuit. South Easthope and Lingelbach were one charge until 1938 when South Easthope and Zion in Tavistock were made a charge.
- 1878: A student missionary, Mr. Fleming, is sent into the Tavistock area by the Presbyterian Church to minister to the Scottish settlers. Services were held in the hall over the sheds of Loth's Hotel (NW corner of Woodstock St. N. and Hope St. W.). There were about twelve adherents. 1882: Tavistock first listed with the Presbyterian Church. John Stewart was the minister and attended to both the North Easthope church (north of Shakespeare) and Tavistock. The Presbyterian Congregation in Tavistock rented from the Baptist Church (the Board of Trade Building) for afternoon services until their own church was built (in 1892).
- 1886: Harmony becomes part of a three-point Methodist circuit with Harrington and Maplewood.



- 1892: The Presbyterians open their new church on the corner of Oxford and William Streets. Rev. Pyke is the pastor.
- 1892: A Union Service is held in the Tavistock "German Methodist" Church (i.e. the Evangelical church) with Messrs Otto, Pyke, and Krupp participating.
- 1904: The Tavistock Evangelical Association congregation build a new brick church.
- 1911: Zorra Evangelical added to the Tavistock circuit.
- 1919: Burns and Tavistock Presbyterian churches are on the same charge again.
- 1922: The East Zorra Evangelicals amalgamate with the Tavistock congregation.
- January 1925: Knox Presbyterian holds vote regarding union. 101 members voted, 75 for and 26 against. 32 members abstained. Knox becomes Knox United Church. Burns votes to remain with the Presbyterian Church as does North Easthope but some members join the new United Church. 1925 The former Presbyterians in Tavistock and the former Methodists in Harmony join to form a two-point charge in the new United Church of Canada. The charge is part of Perth Presbytery, London Conference.
- 1946 The Evangelical United Brethren Church is formed by a union of the Evangelical Association and the United Brethren in Christ (an American denomination).
- 1953 Zion EUB and Knox United hold union services in the summer.
- 1960 Knox appoints a committee to try to bring the two congregations of Knox and Zion closer together.

- 1967: The Canadian Conference of the Evangelical United Brethren passes a motion to join with the United Church of Canada, effective January 1, 1968. Harry and Marie Roppel represent Zion Church at the union service held in Kitchener. Zion Church in Tavistock becomes Zion United Church with the result that Tavistock for a short time has two United Churches (Zion and Knox). Presbytery aligns Lingelbach with the Tavistock Churches.
- September 1, 1969: Grace United Church, Tavistock, is formed by the union of four churches: Zion United in Tavistock (formerly EUB), Knox United in Tavistock (formerly Presbyterian), South Easthope United (formerly EUB), and Harmony United (formerly Methodist). Rev. James Warden (who had been the minister of Knox United) served from 1 Sept 1969 until 29 Nov 1970.
 Subsequent ministers include: Rev. John Tweedie (Nov. 1970 to 1977); Rev. Dan Yourkevich (July 1978 to 1982); Rev. Norman Morton (1983 to 1986); Rev. Paul Field (1987 to 1994); Rev. Robert Biggar (July 1994 to June1999); and Rev. Marion Jackson Tyler (Interim: July 99 to Sept 2000, permanent: beginning Oct 1, 2000).



Addendum

March 1970: Lingelbach United Church and Grace United Church become the 2 point Tavistock Pastoral Charge

October 24, 2010: Lingelbach United Church holds their final worship service
