On Sunday, December 11, Project Good Tidings ends. What is Project Good Tidings? It's a time for us to gather up gifts to help spread good tidings to all. We collect items in bushel baskets for three weeks and see what our gifts together can do. It's really quite amazing what we accomplish together. It's all organized by RECESS (Grade 5-8s). Project Good Tidings challenges the groups, committees and organizations and everyone at Grace UC to give something that will spread the joy and love we know at Christmas. The people we help are associated with the places that the United Church of Canada supports and/or places that we at Grace UC support in our community. This year we are supporting The Christmas Place (Woodstock), Stratford Perth Shelterlink, Tavistock Assistance Program and Optimism Place (Stratford).

Let's break down what the name means:

The word PROJECT as a noun (`prä_jekt) is an individual or collaborative enterprise that is carefully planned to achieve a particular aim. As a verb (prəˈjekt), it is to extend outward beyond something else. The word TIDINGS ('tīdiNGz) is a noun meaning news; information. So, Project Good Tidings is about extending and spreading the good news that Jesus Christ is soon to be born for all, regardless of income, race, gender, job and more.

The day we finish the campaign and bring into worship all the gifts, is a day full of deep meaning and is a very moving and emotional time. The generosity, joy and love from the Grace community fills the sanctuary and

beyond. The next days that follow are of equal emotion as we deliver items to the Christmas Place, Shelterlink, TAP and Optimism Place. If Sunday is about generosity, the next days are about gratitude. Deep gratitude. Gratitude in its purest form.

If you have already brought in your items, THANK YOU! If you have not, please consider how you can be a part of this movement and energy. The details regarding these places and their needs are in this newsletter. The baskets will all be upstairs in the hallway outside the sanctuary to receive your items. 
Do you have a prayer request?

TAVISTOCK ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (TAP)

This year, these items would be most helpful: Stocking stuffers for mostly adults—Socks, treats and gift cards in smaller denominations (\$5-20) for local restaurants, coffee shops, gas stations and stores. Located in Stratford, Sheltherlink exists to provide Perth County youth ages 16-24, who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless, with shelter, advocacy services and basic needs.
