It continues to expand our outreach to people within our church family and to those beyond our walls. From this group, many afghans, sweaters, prayer shawls/blankets, wash cloths, pneumonia vests, Izzy dolls, hats, scarves are given to anyone in need in our community and world.

Without even knowing who would receive it, these tangible gifts of prayer are made specifically for the person who will receive it. Each of these gifts are made to bring warmth to someone who feels a chill. Each of these gifts are made to bring comfort to someone who feels alone. Each of these gifts are made to bring peace to someone in need of prayer. Each of these gifts are made to remind the recipient that they are part of the family of God.

If you have a desire to be part of these projects but cannot attend Wednesday mornings, we invite you to do projects at home on your own time. We are always looking for yarn for projects or donation of money to buy yarn--any help is much appreciated. The supplies are donated from the community or donated by those who crochet or knit. Each time we meet, we share a devotion that refers to knitting and crocheting and so we share this one with you.

NO MORE RUSHING: CRAFT AND BUILD PATIENCE

Sing and make music in your heart to the Lord, always giving thanks to God the Father for everything, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. Ephesians 5:19b-20 (NIV)

Crafters see everything: how a whole afghan is made of many small stitches. How a large bedspread might take years to finish. Crafters know the healing power of patience. In our hurry-up world, we drive fast, eat quickly, and rush past ourselves. Handwork is the opposite. With crochet, I can only go one stitch at a time. This fact forces me to live at a more humane pace. Crochet slows me down to experience moment by moment. I strengthen my patience-muscle. I open my hand to giving thanks. Thankfulness eases my heart and softens it when I have hard feelings toward others. I start with where I'm sitting. I give thanks not just for the objects, but for the people who made the objects possible. Sitting in a plastic chair in a waiting room, I give thanks for chairs to sit in, construction workers who installed them, janitors who clean them, and a hospital board that approved their purchase. I see what it means to give thanks for everything. Not just for the whole afghan but for each stitch. Not just for humanity but for each person. In the end, we are each a stitch that becomes beautifully put together.

Pray with us:

Thank you for my hands, these tools and this yarn.

Thank you for the hands that picked the tea leaves so I could have tea while I crochet. Thank you for my hands.

May they ever serve you, my Lord.

May they every serve you. Amen

From Western Ontario Waterways Regional Council A Request from your President

for the Human Resources Commission

Hello Western Ontario Waterways Regional Council,

This is just a little note with a request from your friendly neighbourhood President. As we are all aware a few years ago The United Church of Canada underwent some serious reorganizing, which created regional councils and we became WOWRC. Part of the reason for the reorganizing was to streamline the decision-making processes (not requiring the same decision to be approved by multiple bodies at multiple meetings), and to help lift the burden of needing so many volunteers, and using up so much time of the representatives of the Regional Councils.

The challenge (and this is where the request comes in) is that a regional council does have a minimum critical mass of volunteers that is needed in order to do the work of the regional council. Due to unforeseen circumstances, the Human Resources Commission has reached this minimum critical mass. The commission is currently running with only 4 members (3 clergy and 1 lay). The second unfortunate aspect is that those who had to withdraw from the HR commission were also serving as liaisons for congregations undergoing the search process for new ministers, so that role now too does not have the support that it needs.

I invite you to prayerfully consider where the Spirit is leading you in helping WOWRC fulfil its ministry to the communities of faith it serves.

If you are able, please fill out an <u>expression of interest</u>. If you are not able to fill one out for yourself, then please tap someone on the shoulder who you feel has the gifts and skills to help out in either of the two roles that are urgently required or in another role for WOWRC. Remember as we heard at the fall meeting you don't have to be a regional representative to be a liaison or on a commission maybe there is someone in your community of faith that has the gifts and skills to contribute to the wider church in this way.

I thank you for your continued prayerful thought on this subject, and may the spirit lead us all to be the church the world needs in these coming years.
