Second Sunday in Lent Out of the Depths

Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I fear no evil; For you are with me; your rod and your staff–they comfort me. Psalm 23:4

Prepare

Psalm 23 is interesting. Even before I considered myself 'churchy' I knew about the 23rd psalm. It's beautiful, it's hopeful, and it's famous. I've heard it read in



church services, it's made appearances in TV shows and movies, it's often sung, and of course, it's read at funerals. I guess what I always missed in the psalm was the sub-text. Yes, this is a song of faith and gratitude to God, who provides the author with love and comfort, but it's more. The author is also having some difficulty-there are enemies at his table. There is the valley of the shadow of death.

I think this is how hope is born. Hope is of course a virtue that we admire in others and kindle within our own souls, but hope is born with hardships and trial. After all, why would a person who has everything in control, who has the ideal life, need hope at all? In an ideal life, there is nothing left to hope for (which I suppose is, ironically, a terrible curse.) Hope isn't buttercups and birdsong; instead, hope is the voice screaming from injustice. Hope is struggling to face a challenge not because we're going to succeed but because it's the right thing to do.

Maybe we could be forgiven if we paraphrase Psalm 23 just a little bit:

Even though I walk through the valley where hope is needed, I fear no evil; for you are with me.

Ponder

What has birthed hope in your life?

Prayer

God of hope, we thank you for your presence in all the seasons of our lives. You laugh with us, cry with us, you don't turn away when we rage at you for the injustices of the world, and always offer us a graceful portion of love. We thank you for building into our souls the capacity to hope, to seek new life, pursue wisdom, and participate in the building of the realm Jesus promised. In hope we pray. Amen.

Practice

There is a psalm for just about every emotion; there are psalms of joy, celebration, and triumph, but also rage, pain, and of course, hope. Try writing a psalm of your own! Maybe sit a while, pray meditate, and focus on your own feelings. Then, without worrying about rhyme, rhythm, or finding the perfect word, write a psalm for your day.

UCC Response to the Phase One Findings at the Alberni Residential Institution

Upon hearing the preliminary research findings on deaths and unmarked graves at the Alberni residential institution, The Rt. Rev. Dr. Carmen Lansdowne, Moderator of The United Church of Canada, said: "The church will not look away from the truth that continues to be uncovered. The United Church of Canada continues our commitment to live into our Apologies, to be accountable, and to further the work of truth and reconciliation in concrete acts of justice and reparation." With deep remorse and grief, <u>The United Church of Canada acknowledges the truth at the Alberni residential institution</u>, which was run by the United Church. This is not new information for Indigenous communities; Indigenous people have been telling the world about deaths and unmarked gravesites for a very long time. We have not always listened to or heard you. The United Church of Canada offers our deepest sympathies for the children who died at the

institution, including those who did not make it home; survivors; the families; communities; and all those impacted by Canada's residential institution system that tore Indigenous children from their families and communities.

The United Church of Canada was an active and willing participant in the operation of residential institutions. We were wrong to participate in this colonial, racist, and oppressive system. In an effort to better live into our faith, we are taking steps to reconcile our legacy as perpetrators in this system. We know that our actions have directly contributed to trauma and death, loss of language and culture, breakdowns of the family unit, and intergenerational trauma.

The United Church of Canada, both regionally and nationally, hears the Tseshaht First Nation's specific Calls for Truth and Justice directed to us, and commits to continued conversation with them about specific actions in response.
