Third Sunday in Lent Searching for Answers

When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors were locked where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came.



John 20:19, 24

Prepare

Thomas gets a bad rap in this text. Jesus seems to use Thomas as an object lesson, and admonishment for wanting proof of God's promise of resurrection. But what if Jesus is actually acknowledging and rewarding Thomas for what he has been up to for the past week (remember, he wasn't in the room the first time Jesus appeared)? Have you ever thought about why Thomas wasn't there? Maybe it's the poignant profundity of the story itself that makes us forget the deep faith of Thomas. This is the man who just a few weeks before in Bethany wouldn't let Jesus go alone to his death but declared he would die alongside him. After the death of Christ, this man had not abandoned his faith . . . but was out following it . . . chasing down rumours, and following up on first hand accounts of Jesus sightings. The reason he wasn't in the room the first time Jesus appeared to the cowering and fearful disciples was because he was searching for the risen Christ. His faith had driven him out into the streets searching for what he knew in his heart was true... that his Lord and Saviour had indeed followed through on the promise that he would be with them again. When Jesus did appear and called him by name, he didn't need to touch the wounds. He already knew his friend and his God. When we are faced with upheavals, trials, and heart-rending experiences, we always have a choice. We can cower like the eleven in fear and doubt, or we can be like Thomas-following leads, searching old haunts, and exploring new ones-intentionally exercising the muscles of our faith. Sometimes we need to move our bodies, get out of our heads, and remind ourselves that Spirit is always working. Sometimes we need to leave the comfort of our despair and go looking for the hope our heart knows-Christ is all around us, blessings abound, life never ends, and God is with us always. It is in these times, when we go searching, that we will hear our name called, a reminder that we are beloved and our God is a faithful God.

Ponder

What would you have done in Thomas's place? What would it have been like to be searching for the risen Christ and then to have him appear before you? How has God responded to your searching in the past?

Prayer

My Lord and my God! How often have I suffered alone, too afraid and despairing to remember your promise that you will never leave me? In these times you have always been faithful, and I am grateful. Before I knew who you were, you searched for me. Give me the courage to search for you in my routines and in new pathways not yet taken. Remind me that you are the way, the truth, and the life . . . and you will never leave me. Give me a seeking heart that recognizes you in the faces and places around me. Amen.

Practice

As often as you are able, take a walk through your neighbourhood/town, stopping to contemplate how God is working right now in resurrecting ways. Imagine you are Thomas looking for evidence of Jesus, listening to the rumours, watching how people interact with each other, searching for leads on how Jesus has been spotted in your neighbourhood. Journal, paint, draw, or write a poem of our reflections. (This idea is based on the Ignatian practice of Biblical contemplation.)
