Palm/Passion Sunday love's cross

Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. 1 Corinthians 13:4-6



Prepare

After waking up early one morning and being unable to fall back to sleep,

my mind began to wander. In its wandering state, it chose to rest on a memory that elicited deep sadness and hurt. The feeling seeped slowly from sadness to resentment, and I heard voices like whispers pulling me in: "How could someone who loves you so knowingly choose to hurt you?" And with eyes welling with tears at the increasing weight of my heart, I closed my eyes and began to pray.

It was while in prayer that I pictured Christ before me. He took my hand in His and showed me his wounds. "Do you understand?" I felt Him say.

Some of the deepest wounds inflicted on Christ are by those who love Him. There are times when, while claiming to love Him, we are simultaneously hammering at the nails. It is very possible to hurt those who love you, even those whom you love wholeheartedly. In our human weaknesses, we hurt each other through our differences, indifference, and mistakes. To hold each other to a standard that we ourselves are unable to attain is both unreasonable and selfish.

Jesus will not be at the entrance to Heaven begrudgingly opening the gates for us while showing us the wounds we had given him. He will not remind us exactly how many lashes he endured to get us there. It wasn't resentment that carried the cross up to Calvary.

Ponder

How to you understand the Passion of Christ? What do you think helped him to endure this coming week? Think of the wounds that you have endured and the wounds that you have inflicted on others. What might forgiveness look like?


Prayer

From the Office of Vocation UCC Bulletin Announcement for Tavistock Pastoral Charge April 2, 2023

An opportunity for you to participate

Within The United Church of Canada, the Office of Vocation has the responsibility of oversight of ministry personnel. Where a question has been raised regarding ministry personnel, the Response Committee may choose to order a review of that ministry personnel's conduct and effectiveness.

On March 16, 2023 as a result of concerns raised by the Executive of the Western Ontario Waterways Regional Council, the Response Committee ordered a review of the totality of Rev. Gail Fricker's ministry under section J.6.3 of *The Manual* 2023.

The Rev. Carol Hancock has been appointed to conduct the review. An ordained minister, Carol served pastoral charges and communities in Saskatchewan, British Columbia and Ontario and then served at the General Council. Now "mostly retired", Carol continues to enjoy work in service of our United Church.

There will be an opportunity for all members and adherents who had direct experience of the Rev. Fricker's ministry to contribute. Carol will conduct interviews by Zoom and telephone, and, if necessary, in person. Inperson interviews will take place here at Grace United on April 11, 2023 and can be booked by contacting Margaret Bakker at 519.529.7428 or margbakker@hotmail.com by April 4th. While most appointments are scheduled for twenty minutes, longer appointments can be arranged if a couple, group or committee wishes to be interviewed together.

Anyone wishing to contribute by Zoom should contact Carol directly at 905.954.1801 by April 9th. Zoom Meetings will be scheduled on April 4, April 5 and the afternoon and evening on Friday April 14th.

Members and adherents can also provide written submissions, either in addition to an interview, or instead of an interview. These need to be signed, dated, and contain the person's contact information should the reviewer need to follow up. Please note: everyone who meets with Carol and/or contributes written material will be named as a contributor to the Review and may be quoted within the Report that Carol will write.

This requirement is essential to ensure both accountability and fair process.

Emailed materials can be sent to Carol at chancek@bell.net or posted to 537 Newmarket St., Holland Landing, ON L9N 1K7. The deadline for written submissions is April 15.

The Review Report will not be made available to the congregation. The Office of Vocation and the Rev. Gail Fricker will receive a copy of the Report and decisions will be made by the Office of Vocation.

The Regional Council understands that the Review process may be a time of uncertainty for all concerned. Please feel free to reach out to Rev. Pastoral Care has also been offered to Rev. Fricker.
