Mental Health Sunday (the first Sunday in May) is part of the church's effort to create communities of radical belonging for all people, including those living with mental health challenges.

5 Simple Things You Can Do

to make the world a better place for people with mental health challenges and their families

- Be a friend. Provide companionship and compassion on the road toward recovery.
 Offer a ride to church or to a local support group. Listen without judgement. Pray for those you know with mental health challenges, substance use disorders, and for their family members.
- 2. **Share your story.** Has mental illness impacted you or your family in some way? Your story may empower others to seek treatment or have hope.
- 3. Watch your language. Pay attention to the words you use and avoid stigmatizing labels. Do not refer to people as "crazy," "psycho," "lunatic" or "mental."
- 4. **Be a "StigmaBuster."** Challenge negative attitudes toward mental illness among your friends and acquaintances and in the media.
- 5. **Learn the facts.** Educate yourself about the various mental health challenges, substance use disorders, neurodevelopmental differences, and other brain disorders. Check out the resources at the UCC Mental Health Network (www.mhn-ucc.org), take a Mental Health First Aid class and host one at your congregation for the larger community.

The Canadian government launched <u>Wellness Together Canada</u>, an online portal where anyone in Canada can receive free mental health and substance use health support. The options range from peer support and self-guided courses to one-on-one counselling with trained professionals.

I am reaching out with a quick update on our redevelopment of peopleCare Tavistock. As shared earlier, peopleCare is building a new 128-bed long-term care (LTC) Home on the land behind the existing building.

With our working drawings approved by the Ministry of Long-Term Care, we are excited to be on track to officially break ground in May. Various activities relating to getting the site ready are already underway and you will notice equipment arriving and fencing going up.

Throughout this project, we will work closely with our construction partners to minimize disruption for our residents, families and neighbours and keep everyone informed. On that note, we want you to be aware of a notice sent out by the Township of the upcoming closure of William St., beginning on Monday, May 1, 2023 for approximately three weeks. The attached document has all of the details.

If you haven't already seen the signs on our property on William Street, we encourage you to take a walk by the front of the Home to see what the new, modern building will look like. It has been a while since I have been able to see most of you and almost 8 years since I was blessed with the scholarship. I was awarded the Grace UC scholarship way back in 2015 and a lot has happened since then! When I was awarded the scholarship I was attending Geneva College, a Christian college near Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania in their student ministry program. I graduated in December of 2018, and using that degree worked as an assistant youth director and office manager at a large church before moving on to a Christian non-profit. Fundscrip Update

Fundscrip is such a fun and easy way to help fundraise for Grace United – but it does take some planning. I appreciate your patience as I work though getting into a

routine with the order process. One of the great things about this program is that we earn money simply by buying gift cards we can use on everyday items.

One of the challenges we face is that because of the valuable nature of the gift cards, they have to be shipped via courier with a signature required for pick-up. If you have ever shipped a package via courier, you know how expensive that can be. These orders are no different. Fundscrip charges a base courier fee for each order, so for small orders where we may have only one or two cards ordered we actually wind up owing THEM money instead of the other way around.

Since orders through the spring and summer months are relatively small, I will be moving to a quarterly order aside from the Christmas season. Order deadlines for 2023 will be:
