## A Memoir 'Turning the World Upside Down' by Lois Wilson


Like me, you may remember that Rev. Lois Wilson was the first female Moderator of The United Church of Canada. I also remember that she was of short stature, but I didn't know anything about her other than those two things. Our church library, located in Knox Parlour contains her memoir written in 1989 and named Turning the World Upside Down, which you will learn that she did as she became a known church leader, in Canada as well as world-wide. I learned that she was a very committed and dynamic woman who wasn't afraid of a good challenge and some of her travel stories are hair-raising as you learn about the risks she took in some remote and not so remote places around the world as the president of the Canadian Council of Churches and then the World Council of Churches. Those experiences led to her involvement with Amnesty International and the Canadian Civil Liberties Association.

She grew up in a manse and knew that when the decision came to become a minister or get married, it was one or the other, but definitely NOT both. She made the decision to marry in 1950 and while helping her husband with all that the wife of a minister does as well as raising four children, she decided to become ordained too. I found her book very informative and interesting as I discovered someone whom I knew very little about, but who was very well respected internationally and had a great impact on the lives of many people who weren't able to advocate for themselves. I think that we in Canada do not understand exactly what she has accomplished and how much she shaped the life of The United Church in Canada and beyond. As I was finishing this memoir, I wished that there was another to tell me what happened next in her life, however, I did have one more book written by her which is also in our library. It is titled Miriam, Mary & Me and written in 1996. From the title you will know that each story is about

women of the Bible, some names that we are familiar with and others that we are not. One story included is written by Jean Little, a children's story author and relates the Biblical story of Five Sisters and how they taught an important lesson to their elders. My thoughts as I read this book was that it would make a good Bible Study resource and lead to much thought, discussion and learning.

The books in the library cover many topics and I'm sure there is something there that would be of interest to you. Please take time to have a look at what is available, take a book, read it and tell others about it and maybe even do a book report for the newsletter just like I did.
