#### **Blessing of the Animals**

The tradition of Blessing of the Animals began with St. Francis of Assisi, the patron saint of animals. Saint Francis first blessed animals early in his ministry sometime **between 1210–1215**.

"The story goes that he was wandering around outdoors one warm afternoon, full of self-doubt, when he noticed a flock of birds in his path. There were doves, crows and all sorts of birds. Swept up in the moment, Francis left his friends in the road and ran after the birds, who patiently waited for him. He greeted them in his usual way, expecting them to scurry off into the air as he spoke. But they did not move.

Filled with awe, he asked them if they would stay awhile and listen to the Word of God. He said to them: "My brother and sister birds, you should praise your Creator and always love him: He gave you feathers for clothes, wings to fly and all other things that you need. It is God who made you noble among all creatures, making your home in thin, pure air. Without sowing or reaping, you receive God's guidance and protection.

"At this, the birds began to spread their wings, stretch their necks and gaze at Francis, rejoicing and praising God in a wonderful way according to their nature. Francis then walked right through the middle of them, turned around and came back, touching their heads and bodies with his tunic.

It has been said that the brothers who journeyed with him stood in amazement.

Then he gave them his blessing, making the sign of the cross over them. At that they flew off and Francis, rejoicing and giving thanks to God, went on his way."-www.franciscanmedia.org




#### Do you have a prayer request?

#### Northern Love: A new project supported by Sit-n-Knit, Stay-n-Crochet



Northern Love run by Callie Haverkamp ships donated second-hand items to people in need in northern communities, often Nunavut and 10 other locations as well. All items are free to those in need. The cost to the recipients is the cost of shipping (\$28 - \$38), although some packages are sent free of charge to those who cannot afford to pay. Within her first year Callie had shipped out almost 300 boxes! In many cases these items are just not available to purchase near their homes.

How can the Grace community can help:

By donating second-hand items: I will coordinate this project (Carol Young when I am away from Oct. 19 until Oct 29) and we welcome donations, which we will accumulate and then invite Callie to pick them up. We have chosen a NEW DEADLINE of October 29<sup>th</sup> to accept items. Callie has sent a list of items which are needed: clothing from infant sizes to adult (no rips or stains please), Bras are very popular, scrubs, Kitchen items, blankets, kid's toys (please nothing huge – they have to fit into a shipping box), kid's books, footwear (no sandals), yarn, fabric, sewing items, craft supplies, fur (coats, hats, mitts, etc. – even if these items have rips or are not in good condition, individuals in the north will repurpose them), baby items (bottles, diapers, etc.), hygiene products, make-up, tooth paste, tooth brushes, soap, etc.

When cleaning out your closets and cupboards this fall, please keep this project in mind. Together we can make a difference to folks in need within our own country. Thank you!

#### The United Church of Canada Calls for Immediate Ceasefire in Israel and Palestine

The United Church of Canada mourns the deaths and injuries already suffered and calls for an immediate ceasefire to the recent escalation in violence in Israel and Palestine. The United Church condemns the attacks launched on communities in southern Israel by Hamas, and the ongoing daily violence meted out against Palestinians by Israel's deepening occupation in Palestinian territories.

Echoing the statement issued by the World Council of Churches, The United Church of Canada is deeply concerned about the risks of spiraling conflict between Palestinian armed groups and Israeli forces, which impacts civilians on both sides the most and only leads to further violence and suffering.

"We pray for the victims and the families of those killed, injured, and abused," said Rev. Michael Blair, General Secretary of The United Church of Canada.

The United Church joins with all those praying for a just peace in the Holy Land and urges global leaders to work urgently for an end to the current violence, an end to the ongoing occupation of Palestinian territories, and a just and lasting peace for Palestinians and Israelis.
